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Prepare for Winter

Although we don't see the blizzards and flooding much of the rest t h e country experiences in the winter, it's still a good idea to prepare for those times that weather issues come to not mention earthquakes that occur at any time. After all, emergencies usually don't give advance notice. Most of the following is information drawn from the Federal **Emergency Management** Agency (FEMA) website. coverage. Many

◆Know your insurance coverage. Many folks don't realize that their homeowners insurance does not cover damages caused by flooding. If you don't have flood insurance, contact your

agent for information about rates and coverage.
Copy important documents (mortgage papers, deed, passports, bank information, etc.).



Keep copies in your home and store originals in a secure place outside the home, such as a bank safe deposit box.

- ◆Take photos of your possessions. Store copies with your other important documents.
- ♦ Save receipts for expensive household items.
- ♦ Make an itemized list of other possessions, such as clothing, books, and

small kitchen appliances. The more comprehensive your list, the better.

Give your emergency contact information to your insurance agent, employer, and family.

- ♦ Prepare an emergency kit. The kit should contain a flashlight, a battery-powered or hand-crank radio, additional batteries, candles, and waterproof matches.
- ♦ Keep a minimum 3-day supply of nonperishable food and bottled water on hand. Emergency services may not be readily available during a disaster, so plan on being self-sufficient during that time.

Speeders Still A Concern

The City has taken measures recently to address the issue of vehicles speeding along East E Street, including stationing a radar speed limit sign and increasing visibility in the area. These efforts have helped reduce the number

of speeding drivers along this stretch, but these incidents are still occurring.

Holiday Parking

At this time of the year, many residents have guests visiting. It's important for your guests to be aware of the parking rules to avoid any potential problems. Some of the rules you and your guests should be aware of include:

♦No parking is allowed in fire lanes at any time. Per Board resolution, owners

and their tenants may be fined up to \$100 for parking in a fire lane. Not only does parking in the fire lane impede access for emergency vehicles, it makes it difficult for neighboring residents to back out of their garages.

♦ Two parking lots on East E Street and the lots on East 5th and East 2nd Streets are the property of the Benicia

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Holiday Decorations Reminder

With the holiday season fast approaching, many homes and businesses throughout the community will be adorned with colorful lights and decorations, including at the Association. If you would like to decorate this season, here are some important rules to keep in mind:

♦ There are no restrictions on lighting or decorating within the units, with the exceptions being 1) Nothing is to be done to the interior that effects the structural integrity of the building and 2) The lighting and/or

decorations may not cause a disturbance to other residents (e.g., lights that shine into a neighboring unit or decorations that play loud music).

- ♦ Lighting and decorations may not be fastened anywhere on the building exterior that would penetrate the building siding, including the decks.
- ♦ Holiday Lighting and decorations should be removed from the exterior within two weeks after the beginning of the new year.

Roof Repairs Starting

Beginning Monday, December 8th, Roofmasters will be performing repairs on roofs throughout the Association. The needed repairs will require Roofmasters to access various levels of the rooftops, so residents should make preparations to ensure their privacy, such as closing drapes and blinds. The repairs are expected to be completed by Friday, December 12th, weather permitting.

Repairs will include refastening or replacing missing shingles and flashing, installing new plumbing collars, and clearing gutters of leaves and debris, among other things.

Nothing extraordinary is required of the residents for this service to be performed, other than to be aware that workers will be accessing the rooftops during these dates.
